









SILVERBELL ROAD, GORET ROAD TO EL CAMINO DEL CERRO Project Update – April 2022

The Silverbell Road corridor extends approximately eight miles from Grant Road to Ina Road and is part of the voter-approved Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) plan. The project, being designed and constructed in three phases, will serve the west and northwest portions of the Tucson metropolitan area. Phase 1, completed from Grant Road to Goret Road and Phase 2, under design from Goret Road to El Camino del Cerro. The timeframe for Phase 3, El Camino del Cerro to Ina Road, is still to be determined.





Design Features

- Widen the roadway to four lanes (two lanes in each direction) with raised, landscaped medians
- Eliminate existing dip crossings and construct drainage culverts that can be used by wildlife
- A continuous, 10-foot wide, asphalt multi-use path along the east side of Silverbell
- 6-foot bicycle lanes between the travel lane and curb (in each direction)
- Traffic signal improvements at Sweetwater and El Camino del Cerro
- LED street lighting
- Native landscaping and water harvesting
- Retaining walls with natural architectural finish
- Public art

Project Schedule - Phase 2

The project team continues to move forward. Major recent and upcoming milestones include:

- March 2019 100% Design Plans
- 2020/2021 Pre-construction planning and investigation of cultural resources (COMPLETE)
- 2022 Pre-construction utility relocation activities, cultural resources investigations ongoing.
- 2022 Begin construction; cultural resources investigations ongoing.
